 - It was asked if we want to continue this project
 - It is organized by Sandra Richardson, who explained that it is a lot of work and she needs twice as many volunteers as she had last year, if it is to happen.
 - → The school has materials from previous years, which greatly helps
 - ➡ It was decided that a request for 8 10 volunteers (minimum) be put out at the beginning of the year, and if we don't get enough, it will not happen this year.
- Sheila asked for a vote on whether the PAC can execute the fund raising plan, as presented the response was overwhelming positive

Report on Funds

- The projected closing balance will be greater than expected

- We can possibly get a kickback from Kids Books to be pursued.

Principal's Report

- Three out of four teaching positions for next year have been filled
- The Reflective Garden will be finished on Wednesday, June 9, weather permitting
- Our school field will be used on Sundays in July and August for a craft fair rented out by the VSB. The PAC is being offered a table, if they want to sell jewellery, crafts, etc.

- Kitsilano Secondary School Renovation Plan is out. They're asking for input/feedback. It will take 4 to 4 1/2 years to complete and could start as early as fall 201 if funding is in place.
