- VSB program for Behaviour Modification has been successful using the Zones of Regulation program. The program was brought in to targeted classes and behaviour data showed a dramatic improvement after the specialist had worked with the classes.

# **DPAC Rep report (Alan)**

**DPAC** are revising their bylaws, changes coming include:

- More consultation and input in policy decisions from parents, including voting rights for DPAC reps from individual schools
- 6-7 positions on 12 member executive opening up
- The DPAC executive election is the day after our last PAC meeting

# **BCCPAC Update**

 BCCPAC AGM was in early May. Resolutions passed included encouraging all school districts to ensure each school has at least one non-gender specific washroom stall and changing room area, and asking the province to fund defibrillators in schools without taking money from elsewhere in the existing education budget to accomplish this.

#### French Immersion

- Five schools (Hudson not among them) are losing one FI Kindergarten class next year, reducing intake by about 20% to a program already in high demand; concerned parents are working together to advocate and will make a presentation to the VSB later this month.
- Canadian Parents for French is also lobbying against this reduction pointing out the benefits of maintaining a strong FI program and a loss of federal per-student FI funding to the district if it proceeds.
- FI enrolment issues are a side effect of the legal decision regarding class sizes; if schools without the capacity to add additional classrooms need to make room for children in the regular program the VSB is prepared to make a temporary reduction in choice program enrolment such as FI
- There is a lack of FI teachers in BC. The VSB actively recruits in Quebec and France; one barrier is the high cost of living and challenge in finding affordable housing in Vancouver.
