Background and context for FIWG

- Strong history of French Immersion as a Program of Choice in the Vancouver School District
- Current issues
 - Ongoing demand for French Immersion program
 - Qualified French Immersion Teacher Shortage
 - Supreme Court of Canada ruling and March MOA
- Impacts of the above on class size, number of divisions and space requirements

FI Working Group – Overall Objectives

Overall goal: Maintain/ sustain the French Immersion Program

- Confirm context for this review
- Engage stakeholder groups (staff, students, parents and partners) in meaningful consultation to inform the review process and final recommendations to be submitted to Senior Management, Committee III and the Board of Trustees
- Identify, consider and respond to information collected regarding delivery of French Immersion (FI) as well as issues and concerns identified by stakeholders
 - Delivery models in other jurisdictions
 - Potential program delivery / reconfiguration alternatives for VSD
- Seek consensus recommendations regarding the delivery of French Immersion in VSD.

FI Working Group – Mandate

- Provide input on the future of French Immersion in Vancouver School District (VSD)
- Identify needs, concerns and potential impacts associated with a variety of delivery models/ reconfiguration alternatives to address questions of placement and number of FI programs
- Provide feedback regarding possible delivery model for the 2019-2020 calendar year (or later), including possibilities for phased implementation

FI Working Group – Role

- Consider information collected to date regarding issues (needs and constraints) associated with delivery of French Immersion in VSD
- Identify additional operational considerations, needs and issues associated with delivery of French Immersion in VSD
- Identify measures to address considerations, needs and issues
- Make recommendations to Senior Management and Committee III (Education and Student Services) regarding delivery of French Immersion in the VSD

French Immersion in VSB – Current State




Kindergarten Choice programs in VSB

- 1. Indigenous Focus School
- 2. Early French Immersion
- 3. Early Mandarin Bilingual
- 4. Fine Arts Focus
- 5. Montessori

French programs in VSB

Over 20,000 total and about 35 years of successful FI programs

- 1. Over 5,000 Early French Immersion students in 17 sites (K to 12)
 - a. 10% of our student population
 - b. Comparable to our neighbouring districts
- 2. Approx.16,000 core French students in grades 5 to 12
- 3. Approx. 150 Late French Immersion students in grades 6 and 7 in two schools
- 4. Approx. 150 Intensive French students in grades 6 and 7 in three schools



Recent impacts on FI Programs

- 1. Restoration of 2001 Collective Agreement Supreme Court of Canada ruling and March MOA
- Lower class size good for teaching and learning
- No K and 1 multi-age classes- unique to VSB and one other district
- Lower class size if students with Special Education Designations

Specific to VSB 2017-2018


- 1. 136 less K spaces including one less K class in five schools
 - a. Hastings
 - b. L'Ecole Bilingue
 - c. Selkirk
 - d. Tennyson
 - e. Trafalgar

Specific to VSB 2017-2018

- 2. More divisions as a result of lower class size
 - a. Last year 165 classes in elementary
 - b. This year 170 classes in elementary

Specific to VSB 2017-2018 (cont'd)

- 3. 5 schools with new French divisions
 - a. Trafalgar
 - b. Kerrisdale
 - c. Douglas
 - d. Secord
 - e. Hastings



Waitlist for Early French Immersion K

- Decreased total number of applicants this year from 893 to 841
- Increased waitlist due to fewer divisions from 313 to 437
- 377 accepted placement

Recent Impacts on FI Programs (cont'd)

2. Qualified French Immersion Teacher Shortage

- 15 unfilled teacher positions in FI
 - (as of early fall) and English teachers now delivering elementary prepetc.
- Recruitment strategy
 - Support current core French teachers wanting to teach FI
 - Work closely with universities
 - Career fairs
 - Presentations at local universities
