We acknowledge that Henry Hudson Elementary is just over 100 metres from the from the lands and village site of Sen'ákw or sən'a?qw [pronounced Senawk] from which Squamish people were sent away by illegally forcing them to sell their land in 1913, the year after Hudson was completed.

Lynne talked about what students and teachers are working on. Every 3 years, a plan is made.
School Learning Plan (improve writing skills):

1) School wide write (collect data K-7) Formative Assessment
2) Newsletters are making learning visible (what teachers are doing in the classroom)
3) 3 students presented the work from their classroom
a) Writing circles (Mme. Norberg) twice a week they share their stories and pick one to share with the class
b) Student: How it helps me learn and gets my brain prepared with the support of friends
c) Student: Read a story about a boy with big teeth and a dentist.
d) Student: Read a story about a boyfriend and a family.
