Principal's Report

 calls you, the communication is sufficient.

SPECIAL DISCUSSIONS Seismic upgrade:

- Project Definition Report (PDR) has been sent to the provincial government
- It has a schematic design of a replacement school. The Vancouver Project Office states this is new
 for seismic projects as new schools were having cost overruns. We still don't know if it's repair or
 replace for the school.
- Livingston Elementary is getting a retrofit and Lord Tennyson is getting a replacement. We are not
 able to see the rhyme or reason for their decisions. The PAC was told that no two 1912 era schools
 were built the same way.
- Don't infer because one school got one thing, we are getting it. This will be based on the government
- There is concern that the school won't be able to handle the development around it. I.e. Molson's and Senákw Development

WHAT CAN WE DO?

Ask for meeting with MLA. The VSB does not have the financial capability to take this, so it was suggested to look into a letter writing campaign. Engage the Squamish Aboriginal community that will also be affected by these decisions.
