We acknowledge that Henry Hudson Elementary is just over 100 metres from the lands and village site of Sen'ákw orsən'a?qw [pronounced Senawk] from which Squamish people were sent away by illegally forcing them to sell their land in 1913, the year after Hudson was completed.

• Arielle Baker, grade 1 French Immersion teacher, talked about the school's diversity club. It is an optional lunch time club, has been at Hudson for a number of years and is a space for grade 5-7 students. They approaching it as a learning, advocacy and safe space for students. The goal is to raise awareness and create an inclusive school. They are working with teachers on their curriculum and resources they use in the classroom. Students are ambassadors outside of the club, have been given pink bracelets to wear. They are currently meeting in 3 separate cohorts and 28 students have signed up
