#### Welcome and Introductions

We recognize that we are gathered on the unceded territory of the Skxwú7mesh [Squamish], x<sup>w</sup>məθk<sup>w</sup>əỳəm [Musqueam], and səlilŵ əta?ł [Tsleil-Waututh] peoples. We acknowledge that Henry Hudson Elementary is just over 100 metres from the lands and village site of Sen'ákw orsən'a?qw [pronounced Senawk] from which Squamish people were sent away by illegally forcing them to sell their land in 1913, the year after Hudson was completed.

## Principal Update

- A staff committee is planning a Sports Day for the end of June. This year it will be called Games Day, focusing on games rather than competitions. Parents will not be asked to volunteer this year due to COVID protocols. The PAC will provide a cold treat
- Teachers are also organizing Bike to School Week in June, details coming soon
- Question about the recent BC Restart plan announcement and if we will see any changes to COVID protocols this school year? Admin is waiting for info from district on relaxing restrictions and will communicate them as they hear.

## Update on Student Behavior and Safety

- It was brought to school administration's attention a few weeks ago that some students were seen with pocket knives on school grounds afterschool. They gathered info from witness reports, identified names, saw students individually and investigated in detail to ensure they had all info then called homes and contacted parents. Parents were supportive. There is a no weapons policy at VSB schools including toys or tools. Students are strongly encouraged to go home afterschool and not gather on school grounds
- Parents spoke up about an increase in aggressive and bullying behavior at school and what is being done. Admin will speak to individual students and classes and involve the school counselor. Question about her role. Jasmine is a youth and family worker who is at the school 2.5 days a week building relationships with students and works with small groups of them on social skills and self-regulation. Admin will get involved when students find conflicts difficult
- It was reported there was a troubling incident today afterschool around 4pm. It generally seems to be happening when staff has left for the day. There is teacher supervision until 3:20pm and then it the parents responsibility afterwards. Students are encouraged to go home afterschool and not gather on grounds
- The school's Code of Conduct can be found <u>here</u>. It was asked to be included in next school newsletter and instruct parents to review it with children
- The school office closes at 3:30pm if a witness would like to report an incident they can call school before then, email after 3:30pm or call next day after 8am with a description and details of the incident.

## **New Business**

- The gaming grant for the PAC was recently applied for
- PAC will provide popsicles for students on Games Day
- Hot lunch planning is underway for September. Will begin with pizza and sushi and PAC voted it return 2 days a week (Tue and Thurs)
