We recognize that we are gathered on the unceded territory of the Skxwú7mesh [Squamish], xwməθkwəyəm [Musqueam], and səlilw əta? [Tsleil-Waututh] peoples. We acknowledge that Henry Hudson Elementary is just over 100 metres from the lands and village site of Sen'ákw orsən'a?qw [pronounced Senawk] from which Squamish people were sent away by illegally forcing them to sell their land in 1913, the year after Hudson was completed.

#### **Music Working Group**

# Teacher Speaker Series: Sandra Wilson, Librarian

- The vision for the library moving forward is a Library Learning Commons model (with both physical and virtual space). It is moving away from a traditional library where it is just books
- Have been working on the physical space getting rid of furniture and weeding the book collection; eliminating dated books and those not reflective of our community and adding more that are. More Indigenous books were added last year and more diverse novels that reflect our population for intermediate students this year

- She is working with Vancouver Public Library (VPL) and promoting their summer reading program
- Looking to host a Scholastic book fair in the fall
