Communication Student Learning (CSL)

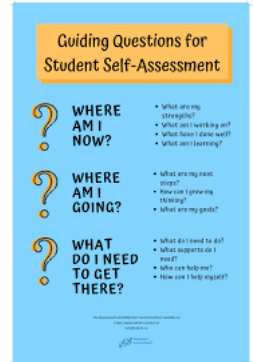
Mid-year Communicating Student Learning (CSL) reports will be sent home at the end of January 2022. Your child's progress report will include descriptive written comments addressing:

- Student learning strengths
- Areas for growth
- Ways to support learning

In addition, there will be a Student Competency Scale (your child's progress in relation to the grade-level expectations):

- BEGINNING to acquire knowledge, skills, strategies, and processes
- DEVELOPING the ability to apply knowledge, skills, strategies, and processes
- APPLYING knowledge, skills, strategies, and processes consistently
- EXTENDING knowledge, skills, strategies, and processes creatively and strategically

We encourage parents to take an active part in giving feedback, setting goals, and supporting their child in their learning. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the classroom teacher or the admin team.



VCH When Should I Keep My Child Home

Please keep your child home if they:

- Have a fever.
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities.
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e., strep throat, chicken pox, measles).
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free at least 24 hours before returning to school.

Keep your child home until they can participate fully in normal school activities or as told by a health care provider.
