City Council Motion for speed reduction on Cornwall

Jade Buchannan - from Vision Zero Vancouver - NGO with goal of ending all traffic fatalities

- ~100 people killed every year in greater Vancouver
- Petitioning a lowering of the speed limit across all Cornwall from Burrard to Trafalgar (30K/hr)
- Researchers have found that pedestrian collisions at 50K/hr are most often fatal, but at 30K very few are
- Working with City Councilor Christine Boyle on a motion to council
 - Would drop the speed limit from 50K to 30K
 - Come back at the end of the summer pilot with additional ways to improve traffic safety
- PAC will circulate a petition and template letters that have been developed to encourage our parent community to 1) speak at the council meeting, 2) sign the petition, 3) email support to our councilors
- Vote is likely to be Wednesday
